

	Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program	<p>LIHEAP is a federal program that provides assistance to eligible low-income households to meet the home's heating or cooling needs. Customers must meet an income threshold that is determined by number of persons in household. For example, through 2015, a household size of 4 may be eligible if annual income is less than \$46,082. 	PG&E Energy-Savings Rebate	<p>Each year, PG&E publishes a residential rebates catalog. When customers upgrade or replace non-energy efficient appliances to a listed more energy-efficient product, they can receive a rebate from PG&E.</p> <p>For more information on participating appliances, call 1-800-933-9555 or visit www.pge.com/en/myhome/saveenergymoney/rebates/index.page</p>
	California Weatherization Assistance Program	<p>California WAP is a federally-funded grant program that is intended to increase the energy efficiency of low-income households. The program is designed to lower total home heating and cooling costs, as well as improve the health and safety of families.</p> <p>Eligibility for WAP is based upon household size and income. Low-income households or households with elderly, children, or the disabled have priority. For example, through 2015, a household size of 4 may qualify if annual income does not surpass \$46,082.</p> <p>Common weatherization practices include sealing the holes and cracks around windows; retrofitting windows, ensuring proper levels of insulation and making sure your heating and A/C systems are working correctly.</p> <p>For Tulare County residents, the local weatherization service provider is Community Services & Employment Training, Inc.</p> <p>For more information, contact CSET at 559-732-4194 or stop by the office at 312 N.W. 3rd Ave. Visalia, CA 93291</p>

	<p>California's Drought Rebate Program</p>	<p>Following Governor Brown's executive order, the California Drought Rebate Program's main goal is to invest in household water efficiency upgrades and to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by implementing a short-term, statewide rebate program for water-efficient appliances and devices. It will provide monetary incentives for the replacement of inefficient water consuming appliances and devices in homes including single- and multi-family.</p> <p>For more information, call 916-654-4287 or visit www.energy.ca.gov/drought/rebate</p>
	<p>Solar Water Heaters & Solar Panels (Federal Tax Credit)</p>	<p>Solar water heaters come in a wide variety of designs, all including a collector and storage tank, and all using the sun's thermal energy to heat water. Solar water heaters are typically described according to the type of collector and the circulation system.</p> <p>At least half of the energy generated by the "qualifying property" must come from the sun. The system must be certified by the Solar Rating and Certification Corporation (SRCC) or a comparable entity endorsed by the government of the state in which the property is installed.</p> <p>Solar panels must provide electricity for the residence, and must meet applicable fire and electrical code requirements.</p> <p>Tax credits include installation costs.</p> <p>For more information, call 1-888-782-7937 or visit www.energystar.gov/about/federal_tax_credits</p>
	<p>Geothermal Heat Pumps (Federal Tax Credit)</p>	<p>Geothermal pumps use the ground instead of outside air to provide heating, air conditioning and, in most cases, hot water. Since these pumps use the earth's natural heat, they are among the most efficient and comfortable heating and cooling products available.</p> <p>Must meet the requirements of the ENERGY STAR program which are in effect at the time of the expenditure.</p> <p>Tax credits include installation costs.</p> <p>For more information, call 1-888-782-7937 or visit www.energystar.gov/about/federal_tax_credits</p>
	<p>Small Wind Turbine (Federal Tax Credit)</p>	<p>A wind turbine works by the wind turning the blades, which connects to a generator and makes electricity.
